We realize that as Charles County slowly begins reopening may will not feel comfortable tutoring in public and therefore virtual tutoring will continue. It the safety of all, CCLC will be offering PPE (personal protection equipment) to you and your adult learner. We will make the arrangements to get you this PPE for tutoring use. All of our assessors will also be provided the same PPE for themselves and the future adult learner they will be assessing. We realize that many already have PPE for themselves. This measure is being taken as a preventive and in case an adult learner shows up without.

\*Workshops - With so many unknown factors and the realization that many will not feel comfortable with a full day, in-person workshop, we realize that we will need to move towards a virtual training workshop using more online training modules offered by ProLiteracy. This is in the planning stages. With Zoom we will be able to break down our full-day workshop into smaller, shorter sessions. We still are hoping to do a one-two hour in-person portion in small groups. That session would involve the hands-on with the program books. The need for tutors has not stopped and will be so important in the months to come. We still need to recruit tutors.



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
