

Dear Literacy Supporter,

At a recent community presentation, someone asked a question we hear often: **“If they graduated from high school, how can they not read?”**

Unfortunately, for many adults, graduation does not mean literacy. One of our learners shared that he spent his school years in special education classes and moved from grade to grade without ever learning to read. He graduated, but he still could not read a job application, a prescription label, or a ballot. His story is not unusual.

Today, **18–20% of American adults struggle with functional illiteracy.** That means millions of people cannot:

- Understand medical directions
- Navigate public transportation
- Complete employment forms
- Help their children with schoolwork
- Vote confidently and independently

This is where the Charles County Literacy Council steps in. We provide **free, confidential, one-on-one tutoring** to adults who want to improve:

- Reading, writing and comprehension
- Basic math skills
- GED and NEDP preparation
- ASVAB scores to enter military service
- English language skills for new Americans

Since 1964, we have trained volunteer tutors and provided **all student materials at no cost.** Every workbook, every teacher manual, every resource is funded entirely through community support—and the need continues to grow.

On **February 28**, we will host our most popular fundraiser, **Adult Trivia Night**, to help ensure CCLC remains a strong, self-sustaining nonprofit. Teams will enjoy a fun evening of trivia competition, heavy appetizers, beverages, desserts, and a silent auction.
